Dear families,

Remembrance

Today we held a service of remembrance, focusing on the significance of the poppy and the work that the Royal British Legion do. Children shared work that they had been doing and the choir sang the songs that they will be performing on Sunday at the Cenotaph. Thank you to Mrs. Swift for coordinating the activities and for all of the donations from the poppy sale – I will inform you of our grand total in our next newsletter.

Behaviour Pathway

After a recent curriculum review carried out by our school improvement partner, it was highlighted how successful our new behaviour pathway in Year 6 has been. This will now be implemented across the school and has already been shared with pupils in an age appropriate way for their year group. This isn't a massive change in expectation, rather a system that is more consistent and clear for our pupils.

Relationship development and positive reinforcement remains at the forefront of our approach to behaviour at Mossley. Our school rules clearly define the expected behaviours in our school – they are centered on what successful behaviour looks like:

- Be kind and considerate
- Be honest
- Be resilient
- Be helpful
- Be respectful

However, this is just one piece of the puzzle. Positive reinforcement and sanctions are both necessary to support whole-school culture. It is important that there is clarity and consistency around what happens when misbehavior continues. The new pathway does use language such as 'amber' and 'red' behaviours. This does not mean that a 'traffic light system' has been reintroduced. Children's names **will not** be displayed publicly for negative behaviour. As part of the restorative process, if pupils demonstrate 'amber'

or 'red' behaviours, then they will be expected to reflect on any misbehavior and how this could improve in the future, alongside a member of staff.

All of the elements discussed above are covered in greater detail in our behaviour policy which can be found on the school website.



Come and join us at our next park run on Saturday 25th November. Not that we are competitive, but other local schools are now doing the Park Run and we would love to have a huge Mossley




turn out! We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible there- 8.45am by the bear. Don't forget your adult and bar code.


