Being a school governor is a vital and rewarding role that allows parents and community members to contribute directly to the improvement of education in their local schools. WHAT IS A SCHOOL GOVERNOR?

School governors are volunteers who work together as part of a governing board to support and challenge school leadership, ensuring the best possible education for students. Governors come from all walks of life and bring diverse skills and experiences.

TIME COMMITMENTS

Being a school governor requires a significant time commitment:

1. Attending Meetings: Governors typically attend full governing board meetings (3/year) and also serve on committees that meet separately (6/year)

2. Reading Documents: Governors must review documents before meetings, including policies, reports, and data on school performance.

3. School Visits: Governors are expected to visit the school during the day to observe and gather information about specific areas of responsibility (Max 3/year)

4. Training: New governors are required to undergo induction/ongoing training.

Being a school governor is fulfilling role that allows parents and community members to make a significant contribution to education. While it requires time, commitment, and ongoing learning, the rewards of seeing positive changes in your local school and the lives of its students are immeasurable.

DUTIES OF A SCHOOL GOVERNOR

As a school governor, your main responsibilities include:

1. Setting the school's vision, ethos, and strategic direction

 Holding the Senior Leadership Team accountable for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
Overseeing the financial performance of the school and ensuring money is well spent

4. Ensuring the school meets its statutory obligations, including safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children.

- Strong communication and teamwork skills
- The ability to analyse data and as challenging questions
- A commitment to improving education for all children
- The capacity to learn and develop new skills
